PRINCIPLE OF THE JOURNEY

The Martin's Cycle Tour is a 6-day, 7-night cycling trip between the Martin's Hotels in Brussels, Walloon Brabant, Flemish Brabant and the Province of Antwerp.

Each stage starts from one hotel and will lead you to the next hotel. You can start your journey from the hotel of your choice that is involved in the Martin's Cycle Tour:

- MARTIN'S RED TUBIZE (Hotel of the Red Devils training centre)
- Between old canals and battlefields
- MARTIN'S CHÂTEAU DU LAC GENVAL Old stones, strange stones and new stones
- MARTIN'S LOUVAIN-LA-NEUVE
 From one university to another, from one century to another
- MARTIN'S KLOOSTER LEUVEN In the land of the river Dyle
- MARTIN'S PATERSHOF MECHELEN Arrival in Brussels on the garden side
- MARTIN'S BRUSSELS EU Beers, forests and traditions

However, if you want to come by car to start the Martin's Cycle Tour, we advise you to start your first stage with an overnight stay in Tubize as presented in this roadbook and therefore to start your journey from the Martin's Red as this one is provided with a car park where you can leave your car for the whole duration of your cycling trip between the hotels.

It is of course possible to do only a few stages and return to your starting point by train. All destinations have a train station and you can board the train with your bike.

TECHNICAL ADVICE

We recommend that you take the Martin's Cycle Tour with confidence:

- Use a recently serviced bike that you have had the opportunity to try and adjust to your measurements.
 Don't hesitate to change the posture settings on the way.
- Depending on the road surface, we recommend that you use good, wide tyres with the correct air pressure. Don't forget to check the pressure regularly.
- Carry one repair kit per person (including a pump) and at least one spare inner tube.
- To get the most out of your trip, to carry only the essentials and to travel light. Two 20L panniers are more than enough to carry everything.
- Take a battery with you to recharge your phone or GPS.

And of course don't forget to take your precious road-book with you!



STAGE 1 TUBIZE > GENVAL BETWEEN OLD CANALS AND BATTLEFIELDS

This imposing Ottonian Romanesque sanctuary has two transepts and two opposing choirs. With its 102-metre long central nave, it is one of the largest Romanesque churches in the world!





STAGE 2 GENVAL > LOUVAIN-LA-NEUVE ABBEYS, CASTLES AND DIVINE BEVERAGES


















You will again travel through Walloon Brabant in the direction of Ottignies and Court St-Etienne. You will then reach the town of Walhain, known as the geographical centre of Belgium and for its feudal castle. You will then go up to the student city of Louvain-la-Neuve via country roads. Belgium's youngest city (built in the 1970s) is known for its special atmosphere, urban architecture and the importance given to greenery. Louvain-la-Neuve is a pedestrianised and dynamic city.


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TO BE DISCOVERED

1 Château de Bousval vineyard



The story is that of a nature lover who owned abandoned land where he decided to establish a vineyard in order to revive it. Three grape varieties share these hilly lands: Pinot Noir, Pinot Gris and Chardonnay. Here, no inherited wine, but a wine in the making, the result of the meeting of the young vine with the Belgian sun, the fauna, the varied flora and the microorganisms of the Bousval soil.

2 Abbey of Villers-la-Ville 🛱 🕮




The Abbey of Villers, founded in 1146, is one of the most prestigious testimonies of the life of the monks of the Cistercian Order.


4 Villers-la-Vigne



Villers-la-Vigne is the vineyard of the Abbey of Villers-la-Ville. Rehabilitated in the 1990s. it consists of a plain and four south-facing terraces, nestled in the middle of a walled area surrounded by stone walls several hundred years old. The vineyard comprises 15 ares planted. With more than 200 members, the Brotherhood of the Villers Abbey Vineyard maintains the vinevard as a team and thus revives the old Abbey vineyard.

5 Marette Farm



The marshal convenes his staff there and takes stock with Generals Gérard and Vandamme. It was now 11.30 am when the first cannon shots were heard in the distance: the Battle of Waterloo was beginning. It is then that General Gérard proposes to stop pursuing the Prussians and to «march with cannon». To which Grouchy replied: «My duty is to carry out the Emperor's orders». The discussion is closed.

Legend has it that Grouchy was late arriving on the plain of Waterloo because he had stopped for too long to eat strawberries from the farm's vegetable garden.





It is a square-shaped farmhouse with a two-storey main building built on a high base, dating from the mid-18th century and featuring a hip roof. The 17th century porch is the oldest part of the present building. This porch has a superb frame in blue stone with bushhammering. Warning: private property - not open to the public.

was its hour of glory because, in 1532, Charles-Quint established the land of Walhain as the capital of a county that included many surrounding villages as well as the town of Wavre. It was at this time that the castle was converted into a pleasure castle. The feudal castle has been classified as a Historic Monument since 1955 and as a Site since 1980. STAGE 3 LOUVAIN-LA-NEUVE > LEUVEN

FROM ONE UNIVERSITY TO ANOTHER, FROM ONE CENTURY TO ANOTHER





















Linking Leuven to Louvain-la-Neuve cannot be done without a little bit of history between its major Belgian university cities. The University of Leuven was founded in 1425 in Flemish Brabant. It is one of the oldest universities in the world. During the 20th century, the Catholic University of Leuven saw its student population gradually split between Flemish and French speakers. At the end of the 1960s, the presence of French-speaking students and professors was increasingly contested by their Dutch-speaking compatriots. In 1968, paving stones were thrown and demonstrations were held with cries of «Walen Buiten» («The Walloons out»). The situation was such that the government of the day fell. This community guarrel, combined with the sharp increase in the student population, forced all the French-speaking faculties of the UCL to move to Wallonia. The municipality of Ottignies hosted the project on the Lauzelle plateau. The first stone of the new town was laid on 2 February 1971. You will leave Louvain-la-Neuve in Walloon Brabant to reach Wavre and its Adventure Park. You will then travel through Flemish Brabant to discover its architectural gems. You will arrive in the historic city of Leuven via the Heverlee woods and the magnificent Parc Abbey!

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TO BE DISCOVERED



A Natura 2000 site, the Lauzelle Wood and its 20-hectare nature reserve are an essential part of the landscape and natural heritage of the town of Ottignies-Louvain-la-Neuve, in Walloon Brahant.

On the edge of the noisy student city, this hilly and varied green space is a real haven of peace.

2 Adventure Parc Wavre

In the heart of nature, the Wavre Adventure Park offers 24 tree climbing courses and 240 games in the trees, suitable for all levels. A play area is accessible from 4 years old. Make the big bungee jump or go full speed ahead on the 45 zip lines with a total length of 2.5 km! Discover the 320-metre long zip line with bends. A unique experience in the Benelux! A giant catapult also propels you 17 metres high. All tree games are fully secured by a continuous lifeline. Since 2020, an interactive lasergame awaits you to conquer the Beumont fortress. And to relax, 3 terraces and a reception centre with cafeteria are at your disposal. Test your adventurous soul and climb up into the trees at Adventure Parc!

In the fourteenth century, a first castle was built here by the Dukes of Arenberg. The de Croy family received the estate in 1446. From the beginning of the sixteenth century, the present castle was built in the Renaissance style. In the nineteenth century, it was largely transformed into a neo-gothic style. In 1916, the Duke of Arenberg donated the estate to the University. Today, the castle is occupied by the Faculty of Applied Sciences of the KU Leuven and forms the heart of a green campus for the Wetenschap&Technologie (Science & Technology) group.



STAGE 4 I FUVEN > MECHELEN IN THE LAND OF THE RIVER DYLE



















During this stage you will mainly drive along the Dyle. In the land of the Dyle, the brewers even had a canal dug to transport the barrels of beer from Leuven to other cities. But where does the Dyle come from? The Dyle has its source in Houtain-le-val in Walloon Brabant. It flows through the municipalities of Court-Saint-Étienne, Ottignies-Louvain-la-Neuve and Wavre. In Flemish Brabant, the Dyle becomes the Dijle and flows through Rhode-Sainte-Agathe, Sint-Joris-Weert, Korbeek-Dijle and Heverlee before reaching Leuven. In Leuven the Dyle also passes through the large beguinage. It will then continue its journey as far as Mechelen, before forming the Rupel by mixing its waters with the Nèthe. A day where you can taste beer, walk through provincial parks and visit a zoo. On arrival in Mechelen, you will pass Kazern Dossin for an important memorial before reaching the hotel, famous for being housed in a former church.

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

STAGE 5 MECHELEN > BRUSSELS ARRIVAL IN BRUSSELS ON THE GARDEN SIDE




















From Mechelen, you will cross Flemish Brabant to the Botanical Gardens of Meise and the Bouchout Castle at the gates of Brussels. You will arrive in the capital from the north, along the royal domain and past the Atomium. You will pass the historic Tour & Taxi site to reach the city centre by the canal. You will reach the hotel via the historical Brussels, the Sablon district, the Royal Palace, the Cinquantenaire Park and the European district. A rich day out to and in the Capital of Europe.

The route information, places to discover, junctions and circuits (complete roadbook) will be communicated to you at the time of booking. You will then be able to download the GPX track in the application of your choice.



TO BE DISCOVERED

1 Grimbergen Abbey 🛱 🗗



Grimbergen Abbey is an abbey in the centre of Grimbergen, founded in 1128 by the lord Gauthier Berthout. Grimbergen beer has not been brewed at this location for over two centuries, but it is well worth a visit. For beer lovers, the Abbey Beer Museum waiting for you.

2 Bouchout Castle



The castle dates back to the 12th century and was once the residence of Charlotte, Princess of Belgium and Empress of Mexico. You can admire it but it is not open to the public.

Come and discover one of the largest botanical gardens in Europe! This historic estate of 92 hectares of greenery has something for every nature lover. 18,000 species await you! Come and admire the beautiful and interesting outdoor collections: medicinal and aromatic plants, rhododendrons, conifers, maples...

3 Atomium



A symbol of Brussels and Belgium and a unique achievement in the history of architecture, the Atomium is now the most popular attraction in the capital of Europe.

Built for the first post-war World's Fair [Expo 58], its nine spheres depict an elementary iron crystal magnified 165 billion times and embody the belief in science and progress.

4 Grand-Place



Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the The Leopold Park, located in the heart of the Grand-Place began to be built in the 15th century, first with a few guild houses and then with a Town Hall to establish the authority of this commercial centre.

5 BELvue Museum

Presenting itself as the museum of Belgium and its history, but also as a 'centre for democracy', the museum has recently been completely redesigned. Democracy, prosperity, solidarity, pluralism, migration, languages, Europe: the BELvue Museum offers you the opportunity to discover the country through these themes.

7 Cinquantenaire Park and Autoworld



The museum is located in a prestigious building in the Parc du Cinquantenaire, built in 1880 to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the creation of the Kingdom of Belgium.

Autoworld is more than 300 vehicles, coaches and motorbikes of different origins that trace the history of the automobile and illustrate the spectacular development of vehicles over more than a century.

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STAGE 6 BRUSSELS > TUBIZE BEERS, FORESTS AND TRADITIONS

















You will spend part of the day in the woods: the Bois de la Cambre and the Forêt de Soignes. A real green lung for the capital. You will also cross the Pajottenland in Flemish Brabant, southwest of Brussels. Pajotteland is the land of hops and beer, especially lambic and queuze. It is a very fertile and hilly agricultural region between the rivers Senne and Dender and the Senne valley. It is part of the green belt of Brussels.

You will leave Brussels via the Bois de la Cambre and the Forêt de Soignes. After crossing the forest, you will arrive at the foot of the Lion of Waterloo. You will pass by the provincial domain of Huizingen and the magnificent Beersel Castle before reaching the hotel via Halle along the canal. A day of hop tasting in prospect!

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TO BE DISCOVERED

1 Bois de la Cambre

The Bois de la Cambre is located at the end of Avenue Louise. This English-style park with its forest-like layout owes its name to the nearby Abbaye de la Cambre. It is a unique jewel of Brussels' heritage, which has nothing to envy to the emblematic «Central Park» in New York. People come here all year round to walk, jog, cycle and rollerblade. At weekends, several roads are closed to cars to make room for alternative mobility. The Bois de la Cambre is an offshoot of the Forêt de Soignes. It covers an area of 123 hectares. In 2004, the wood was declared a special conservation area by Natura 2000. More than 80 trees are listed in the inventory of remarkable trees in the Brussels-Capital Region. In addition, the Bois de la Cambre is



home to 16 species of bats. From time to time, roe deer come out of the Forêt de Soignes to roam the area.

2 Forêt de Soignes

The Forêt de Soignes is an exceptional green space, which was included on the Unesco World Heritage List on 7 July 2017, as part of a series of 78 remarkable beech forests located in 12 European countries. Although it has had a particularly rich history, due to demographic changes and land use, its original relief has been remarkably preserved. Thus, under the dark canopy of this cathedral beech forest, the area where reindeer and mammoths once walked is exceptionally present.

3 Bois des Bruyères

In the past, charcoal was produced on this former part of the Forêt de Soignes. Today, take the opportunity to walk around the lake (3km) and admire the lush nature that surrounds it.

4 Provincial domain Huizingen 🕮 🥤



The provincial estate stretches around Huizingen Castle. Here you can take a dip in the heated outdoor pool or enjoy a game of miniature golf. The various sports facilities in the park attract fans of football, tennis, fishing, canoeing or athletics. Would you rather go for a walk? Numerous paths and theme trails lead you through the entire estate. Children can have a great time in the animal park, the playgrounds or the mini cars.

And let's not forget the arboretum of deciduous and coniferous trees, which unveils a carpet of daffodils, azaleas and hyacinths in spring. The oriental-inspired rock garden with more than 1200 plant species offers an unparalleled palette of colours.

5 Oud Beersel

The Oud Beersel Brewery, founded in 1882, is one of the last authentic lambic breweries in Belgium. It is known for its artisanal lambic brewed according to old traditional methods.


The lambic matures for up to three years in wooden barrels, after which it is cut up and processed into Vieille Gueuze. By fermenting sweet-tasting cherries in the lambic and after a second fermentation in the bottle, the Vieille Kriek is created. This unique brewing process



with spontaneous fermentation is possible in Belgium, namely in the regions of Pajottenland, the Senne Valley and Brussels, due to the presence of specific microflora.



8 Boon Brewery



The beginnings of what is now the Boon Brewery date back to 1680. The brewery was named after its new owner each time and in 1977 René De Vits sold it to Frank Boon as a gueuzerie.

The brewery is one of the few to use the 'cloudy wort' method, the oldest traditional brewing method for lambic. Boon Brewery supplies lambic to pubs and produces a classic Oude Geuze and Oude Kriek, as well as a strongtasting Boon Kriek.
