PARC MONCEAU


Built in the 18th century by the Duke of Chartres

PARC DES BUTTES CHAUMONT


Inaugurated in 1867 by Napoleon III






JARDIN DU LUXEMBOURG


JARDIN DES TUILERIES






BOIS DE BOULOGNE Forest transformed into a park in 1852

JARDIN DES SERRES D'AUTEUIL


Built in 1761 by Louis XV, redesigned in the 19th century.

PARC DE BAGATELLE Built in 1775




JARDIN DU TROCADÉRO

JARDIN DU PALAIS ROYAL




PARC GEORGES BRASSENS Opened to the public in 1985


PARC FLORAL DE PARIS Inaugurated in 1969










PARC DE LA BUTTE DU CHAPEAU ROUGE Opened to the public in 1939








PARC MARTIN LUTHER KING
